Elizabeth A. Dinces, MD, received a \$40,000 Career Development Award for her project entitled, "Rapid Encoding of Intensity in School Age Children". Dr. Dinces, an Assistant Professor of Otolaryngology at Montefiore Medical Center in Bronx, New York, is a candidate for Active Fellowship in The Triological Society. Her project will be completed in September, 2006. After completion of her residency training program, Dr. Dinces completed Fellowships in ERP research and clinical neurotology/otology at Northwestern University. In 2004, she received an M.S. in clinical research methods from Albert Einstein College of Medicine.

**Dr. Dinces joins forty-four previous grant recipients who have received more than \$1 million in grant funds from the Triological Society since 1994.**

The Society continues its commitment to support research by young investigators through participation in the CORE (Combined Otolaryngology Research Efforts) grant program administered by the AAO-HNSF. The Society will have \$200,000 available in 2006 to award to otolaryngologists-head and neck surgeons who hold full time, part time or contributed service medical school faculty appointments and who have made a commitment to focus their research endeavors on patient-oriented research.
